#### THE HEROINE

### THE HERO

Reeve is a 27-year-old newspaper journalist who lives in the room next to Flossie's at Klausmeyer's boarding house. He channels his frustration with Flossie and her role as a New Woman by composing an anonymously written short story in which she is the inspiration for the main character. To his surprise, his editor makes him serialize the story for the newspaper, leaving him in the untenable position of having to create more scenarios about the very woman he'd like to avoid.

### Clara Driscoll

#### **THE BOSS**
